#### The Board of Supervisors, County of San Diego, Presents a Proclamation to AAUW Fallbrook on our 70th Anniversary Year

AAUW Fallbrook has been honored by the Board of Supervisors for all the work that we have done in the community for 70 years. Supervisor Bill Horn has presented us with a framed proclamation. We will find a fitting place to put this on display. Thank you to Sherry Ludwig for advocating on behalf of our branch with the Board of Supervisors! Sherry read the proclamation to those present at our Christmas Party.

Our History:

On November 28, 1881, Marion Talbot and Ellen Richards met in Boston with 15 alumnae representing eight colleges to discuss the needs of college-educated women. In addition to broadening opportunities and assisting other women in higher education, they discussed the formation of the Association of Collegiate Alumnae, the AAUW's predecessor organization.

Since its first meeting in 1881, AAUW has been a catalyst for change. Our nonpartisan, nonprofit organization has more than 170,000 members and supporters across the United States, as well as 1000 local branches and over 800 college and university partners. Throughout our history, AAUW members have examined and taken positions on the fundamental issues of the day—educational, social, economic, and political.

Shortly after the end of WWII, on June 24, 1946, twelve visionary women met to discuss the formation of an AAUW chapter in Fallbrook. At that meeting, they formally adopted a constitution and bylaws and agreed to apply for national recognition. On September 30, 1946, 70 years ago, nineteen women met for their first AAUW Fallbrook business meeting. The programs they chose for the upcoming year were Education, Social Studies, Travel, and Interior Decorations.

As we celebrate our 70th year, we give recognition to those women who came before us who have made such a difference in the lives of so many women in our community.



#### Public Relations/Publicity:

Functions of the PR chair include informing the community through the media and press releases of AAUW's mission, inviting the public to fundraising events, informative events and sharing with them the accomplishments of the young women AAUW seeks to advance through scholarships, and a mentor/mentee program, as well as Tech Trek camp and other mission-oriented occasions.

The photographer chairperson, Nancy Heins Glaser, whenever possible, provides photographs to include with press releases.

Members of Fallbrook AAUW are encouraged to send to the PR chairperson, Lana Smith, additional photos they may have taken or inform her of new media contacts or interesting information that might be used to further advance the goal of informing the public. If photos are provided, names and proper spelling of all the individuals in the photos should be included, listing them from the left to right side of the photo for the caption.

Photos without a caption of names generally will not be publishable.

Currently, the local paper permits AAUW Fallbrook, as a nonprofit organization, one published article per month, and therefore, combining various events into one submission to get the most public attention possible each month is often required. Although a number of photographs can be submitted, the editor, exercising editorial liberty, may decide which photographs are permitted based on space availability. So, there is no guarantee that every photo or all the information can be included. The guidelines for article submission include a limit of 300 words or less, or they may be subject to being edited down due to space considerations. Announcements of events for the Event Calendar are to be kept to 100 words or less, and we can accompany them with a photograph if appropriate to the announcement. The event will not be repeatedly published in the Event Calendar and regular meetings of AAUW do not qualify for the Event Calendar.

The *Village News* has asked that we have one contact—the public relations chair for AAUW releases, and that individual will send in the submissions to avoid confusion and unintentional cross purposing.
