n 1946, not long after the end of WWII, twelve visionary Fallbrook women came together to form the first Fallbrook branch of the American Association L of University Women (AAUW). It was to be dedicated to the mission of broadening opportunities for women and girls, especially in the pursuit of higher education.

Their groundbreaking efforts were not has become a model for wasted. Seventy years later the organization continues to thrive in Fallbrook, and as a result of the local branch's expanded goals, many young women who graduated from Fallbrook schools were, and continue to be, afforded the opportunity to attend universities and colleges by way of scholarships awarded by Fallbrook's AAUW.

On June 11, 2016 the current membership gathered at the old Reche Schoolhouse to celebrate those pioneering women, as well as to honor special women-former officers and innovators-who were the architects far-sighted of manv programs, including a mentorship program that

MINUTES OF JULY 30, 2016 BOARD MEETING

The meeting was called to order at 10:20 a.m. by President Elizabeth Leader. She outlined her goals for the year with a focus on recruiting members and raising our visibility with good PR. She set the frame for our discussions about the coming year. A brief discussion followed on San Marcos/Cal State where several mentees are registered. CSUSM is an AAUW Affiliate University and they have a student group. Elizabeth is investigating the group to see how we can support them.



There followed a free-form discussion on finding new/younger members. It was suggested that Newcomers and Encore Club are both a good source for newer arrivals in town. We will try to make contact with these groups.

• There are other clubs and nonprofits where we might affiliate for activities and to raise awareness of what we do.

One suggestion is a display table at the Library one Saturday. Lana said that she would follow up on this possibility. It would be nice if we could enhance AAUW presence on social media. Linking Friends of Fallbrook was one idea. We could put our national brochure at the Chamber of Commerce and include an insert on our chapter. We set up a phone tree to call the 27 members of the disbanded San Marcos/Vista chapter who agreed to be contacted, to invite them to our chapter. • To increase "stickiness" of new members, we discussed assigning a mentor to each new member. TRESURER'S REPORT

Margaret Singleton, as treasurer. discussed our fund balances. We have cashed in the Legacy agency account and moved it to savings. We began July 1, 2016 fiscal year with \$27,936.35 still in Legacy endowment. In July the balance of the Legacy AGENCY fund was deposited and that was for \$31,582.64. At the beginning July we also had 13500.03 in the checking account. There followed a discussion of the draft 2016-17 budget items in detail. Margaret will revise the prelim budget based on the discussion. Since the budget as drafted requires a transfer from our savings account to balance (over \$1500) the suggestion was made that we should try and hold an

additional fund raiser to balance current income and expenses or cut expenses so that we have a balanced budget. This will only be possible if we only give scholarships equal to amount from our Legacy income and what we raise in the garden tour or in individual donations or grants we receive. The group agreed that \$1000 in scholarships be devoted to continuing education.

HONORING MEMBERS There was a short discussion on honoring two respected member who have died: Bev Thordarson and Lin Payne. It was decided to create a scholarship in each of their names. Meeting adjourned at 1 p.m.

Betty Gilby on Honor Flight to Washington DC



Betty Gilby was honored recently by Honor Flight San Diego, a nonprofit organization that escorts veterans to Washington DC to see their memorials. Honor Flight recognizes the service and sacrifice of veterans to the U.S. and its citizens. Many WW II veterans have never seen their memorials; it is the top priority of this organization to send the most senior veterans, currently World II survivors, and veterans who are terminally ill, to visit their memorials. Betty and a companion traveled to DC last week and returned home on Sunday, October 2 to a greeting crowd at Lindbergh Field.

Betty was a Registered Dietician in the U.S. Army and served for approximately 3 years in Algeria, North Africa, Italy, and Yugoslavia. Her unit was scheduled to relocate to Japan just before the bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki; because of this, she was able to return to the U.S.

22nd Annual Math and Science Recognition Breakfast

On April 22, 2016 the Fallbrook Branch of the American Association of University Women (AAUW) and the Fallbrook Union Elementary School District sponsored the 22nd Annual Math and Science Recognition Breakfast at the Fallbrook Library. Seventh and 8th grade young women who have demonstrated high interest in science or math (and so selected by their teachers) were honored at the breakfast program.

Also honored were six students who were selected to receive scholarships to the 2016 AAUW Tech Trek Math & Science Camp at UCSD from June 19 to 25. Scholarship winners include Erin Flynn, Paige Mansell and Kathleen (Katy) Teel from Sullivan Middle School along with Grace Bell, Kaitlyn Collings and Laura Garcia from Potter Jr. High. Two alternate winners were also chosen, Caroline Saple and Jenna Jedlicki from Sullivan Middle School.

At the breakfast the young women and their parents heard four successful women speak about their work in STEM fields (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math), and their career journeys.

This year's speakers were Dr. Dana Chan, Ophthalmologist, of San Diego Eye Care Center; Teresa Fiske, Computer Engineer with SAIC (Science Applications International Corporation) and Hewlett Packard; Cindy Pessotto, Pharmaceutical Sales Manager, formerly with Novartis; and Margaret Singleton, who spoke on nontraditional careers with a STEM education.

AAUW Fallbrook Mentoring Program Description

he AAUW Fallbrook Mentorship Program is in its 21st year. We match our members with female sophomore students from Fallbrook High School for a three-year mentorship. The young women in our mentorship program are recommended by the director of the AVID Program at School. Fallbrook High AVID Individual (Advancement Via Determination) is a global nonprofit organization dedicated to closing the achievement gap by preparing all students for college and other postsecondary opportunities. They focus on students with good grades and high need some potential who extra enrichment to prepare them for college. The girls in this program are generally from a lower socioeconomic level, some with parents who do not speak English and who will be the first in their family to attend college.

The AAUW mentors provide fun and educational trips during the year to concerts, museums, art galleries, and plays. Some activities are done in groups and others are one-on-one. We also provide coaching sessions to help our mentees prepare for speaking publicly.

When the young women are seniors, their mentors also take them on campus visits and assist them with preparing college/scholarship applications. The one-on-one support we give to our mentees allows them to experience a variety of activities with an educated woman outside of their family circles and teachers, and helps to broaden their worldview. It also gives them another resource for advice on college, careers, and life in general.

Our Mission

To provide enriching activities that will expand the horizons of young girls in our community and to create a supportive relationship that will allow us to coach these young girls to help them achieve their dreams.

Our Vision

A community of young girls who have the opportunity to fulfill their true potential, to believe in their selfworth, and to be motivated to be leaders in their own lives and their communities.

Values

We believe in the following values:

- The power of positive role models and mentors to enhance a young woman's sense of self-worth and thus drive her toward excellence in all aspects of her life
- Respect for the worth and dignity of individuals, particularly women and girls
- The inclusion and acceptance of the differences and perspectives of others

- The ability to affect social change for women

AAUW Fallbrook Mentoring Program, 2016–2017

Our group this year—which includes one new senior and 4 new sophomores—consists of 5 seniors, 8 juniors, and 4 sophomores. All of these girls have been referred to us by their FUHS AVID teachers. The high standards for being and staying in their school's AVID program ensure that we are mentoring the most deserving girls in the school, and we look forward to having many special one-on-one moments with this group of mentees.

Continuing mentors Barbara Luther, Cathy Monroe, Celia Martinez, Eileen Hider, Elizabeth Leader, Judy Egan, Karen Langer Baker, Kathy Bierbrauer, Karen Estes, Rosie Scheller, Rosemary West, Teresa Fiske, and Terri Keyes welcomed our newest mentor, Gay Smith, who is also a new AAUW member!

We all met with our newest mentees and their mentors at a recent Orientation Meeting/Ice Cream Social and, after each shared a little about herself, we firmed up our group activities for this school year. Scheduled are a train trip to Old Town during Thanksgiving vacation, our annual Christmas party, a special Culture Day in the Spring, and attending the Tech Trek breakfast where we will hear talks by various women whose careers have been in the technical and science fields.

Once again, Rosemary West and Karen Langer Baker will conduct coaching sessions for the girls in preparation for our Speech Trek contest, which will be held the last Friday evening in March. This year, we will present a more flexible plan for choosing a topic for the speeches, following the general format of the State AAUW Speech Trek contest but more suited to our girls' interests.

Rosemary and Karen conducted the first Speech Trek coaching session on Monday, October 3, which was attended by eight of the mentees. Based on those in attendance, Mondays and Tuesdays are their most available days of the week. Once we hear from those who were unable to attend this session, we might change, but for now, our next session will be Tuesday, October 18th.
