Young Eagles

In 1992, the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) started a program called "Young Eagles." The program was created to introduce young people, aged 8 through 17, into the world of General Aviation by providing a free plane ride. These flights are offered through the generosity of local members of the EAA who volunteer their time and aircraft.

The program has maintained its popularity, in part, because of its simplicity. A pilot and each Young Eagle conduct a preflight check of an airplane, focusing on how the airplane works and how pilots prepare to fly safely. They then board the aircraft and take a brief (usually 15 to 20 minute) flight, where young people can discover more about the aircraft and the unique perspective from the sky.

Following the flight, each Young Eagle receives a certificate signed by the pilot and has his or her name entered in the "World's Largest Logbook," which is on permanent display at the EAA AirVenture Museum and through the website at www.youngeagles.org.

EAA Chapter 1279 (Murrieta) and Friends of the Fallbrook Community Airpark combine their efforts and conduct Young Eagle flight rallies twice a year at the Fallbrook Airpark. The dates typically fall on a Saturday in the months of April and October. Information regarding the Young Eagles program may be found at www.youngeagles.org.

From Joy Frew, AAUW Fallbrook Policy Chair

The 2018 Legislative Session is dominated by issues brought to the forefront because of the efforts of the #MeToo, #TimesUp, and #WeSaidEnough campaigns. More than a dozen bills related to fighting sexual harassment, both in the Legislature and more broadly have been introduced. This movement has helped keep the momentum going in the fight for #EqualPay, and AAUW CA is pleased to continue the fight by cosponsoring two bills—AB 2282 (Eggman), to refine the language now in law from previous efforts on prohibiting employers from asking for prior salary in the job interview process, and from using it discriminatorily should they obtain it (such as in job promotions within the company) and SB 1284 (Jackson) on pay transparency. We continue to work with the Stronger California coalition on the Women's Economic Agenda. The Pay Equity Taskforce is monitored as it continues its work under the California Commission on the Status of Women and Girls to develop tools for employers and employees related to implementation and compliance of the California Equal Pay Act.
