# News from Our Mentoring Program Karen Langer Baker, Chair

## Focus on speech coaching

Tine mentees attended our first speech coaching session in Room 23 at 3 pm Monday, January 28. We will be meeting every week through March. The contest will be Friday evening, March 29, in the community room of our library.

The girls learned about the three categories used by the judges, who are members of Toastmasters: Content (speech development, effectiveness, and speech value) counts for 50%; delivery (physical, voice, and manner) counts for 30%; and language (appropriateness and correctness) counts for 20% of the vote.

We also covered the six characteristics of an exceptional presenter

- 1. Organized... prepared, polished, and poised
- 2. Passionate... Persuasive and contagious energy with body language, facial expressions, movement, gestures, and voice
- 3. Eye contact... Smile, humor, involvement with audience
- 4. Natural... Comfortable, conversational, open, engaging, spontaneous, offthe-cuff
- 5. Understand... What attendees have in common, what they know or don't know about your topic
- 6. Practice... Inflection, voice volume, I contact, gestures, posture, avoid fillers

We discussed the various topics (such as self-esteem, stereotypes and biases, strategies for introducing change, portrayal of women in the media, sexual harassment, work and family challenges, etc.) that will include research on a woman who exemplifies the girl's choice by making a difference in our world today.

Some of the girls who cannot attend on Mondays are invited to attend on Thursdays. So far, only two girls have confirmed. I am hoping more will. Please let me know if any of you will be attending Thursday sessions.

Also in attendance today were my co-coach Lesley Ibaven and mentor BJ Lane. A former AAUW member and mentor, Chris Assad, has moved back into town and will also be participating in this activity.

All mentors are welcome to attend any of our sessions on Mondays or Thursdays. If your mentee is participating and you have the time, we would love to see you there.

She has been renovating her historic merry-go-round in Griffith Park in Los Angeles. # From Our Policy Chair Joy Frew

#### Tell Congress: Support Immigrant Youth!

For over 135 years, AAUW has advocated for increasing access to higher education. We support the civil and human rights of all immigrants, including a fair and just path to legal status. And we know that our higher education system and our economy are stronger because of the contributions of immigrant youth.

Since 2012, the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program has provided nearly 800,000 immigrant youth the ability to attend school, go to work, and contribute to our economy without fear of deportation. But in 2017, President Trump moved toward ending the DACA program, which would take with it the opportunity for thousands of immigrants to access higher education.

We need a permanent, long-term solution for DACA recipients and immigrant youth. They are an integral part of our education system and overall community.

AAUW understands the impact that education has on the lives of students and on the nation's overall prosperity and strength. The DACA program has opened the doors of opportunity for thousands, developing a skilled workforce prepared to compete in the global economy. Our commitment to increasing opportunities in education for all women and girls stands firm.

#### A New Day for Women

The year has barely begun, and women are already shattering records and making history. When the new Congress convened in January, nearly a quarter of its voting membership was comprised of women—the highest percentage ever. And women now hold roughly 28 percent of state executive positions. While women remain underrepresented in business, government and nonprofits—and even more progress is needed among the ranks of elected officials—this achievement is worth celebrating. After all, just 10 years ago, the percentage of women in Congress hovered around 16 percent. Having diverse new voices in policymaking will matter as AAUW embarks on an ambitious agenda to advance equity laws at the state and federal levels.

The U.S. House of Representatives is expected to take up many AAUW priorities this coming year, including the imminent introduction of the Paycheck Fairness Act, which would strengthen the Equal Pay Act of 1963, help women challenge pay discrimination, and give employers incentives to comply with the law. <u>Ask your members of Congress to co-sponsor this important legislation</u>:
