A 1952 Frank Capra movie about the water-rights battle between Fallbrook residents and the U.S. government (Camp Pendleton). Though not even in the credits by name, Capra was the mover and maker behind this cold war-era movie. Capra had worked for the war department and produced a series of propaganda films to encourage citizens to get behind the war effort fighting Nazism and Fascism. Though his films were intended to be presented as integrity pictures, even his friends called the movies "Capra Corn."

Why now? Capra brought a suit against the U.S. government ... and finally won in 2018! The conjunctive use water project (by the Community Garden) with Fallbrook Public Utility District (FPUD) and the U.S government is coming together thanks to one man's fight. All Capra wanted was to be able to share rights for water use from the Santa Margarita River Project, and it's happening now ... 69 years later!


