Speakers: Stephanie Ortiz and Leticia Maldonado-Stamos. Miss Ortiz is a former mentee of the Fallbrook AAUW High School Mentoring Program.



#### Stephanie Ortiz

Stephanie has worked with bicultural and bilingual communities for over 6 years. She is a Mixtec woman who was born and raised in Fallbrook and firstgeneration daughter of immigrant parents. Access to education and health and social service resources have been at the forefront of her work. Stephanie holds the role of a Community Health Advocate with Vista Community Clinic within the Migrant Health and Outreach team housed in the Health Promotion Center. She obtained her B.A. in Sociology from the University of California, Irvine. Ms. Ortiz has dedicated the last six years to community mobilization, social services and advocacy in areas including: immigration, education, workforce development and currently public health. Ms.Ortiz is an active member of the Fallbrook Human Rights Committee as well as an outreach liaison and volunteer with a humanitarian search and rescue organization, Aguilas del Desierto, Inc an organization who focuses on the rescue and recovery of miss-

ing migrants along the US/Mexico border. Her passions involve community building, food justice and revitalizing traditional ecological knowledge. Stephanie and Leticia are team authors of the redistricting map adopted by the San Diego County Board of Education in May 2019. This is to ensure trustee area elections for the Fallbrook Union Elementary School District.



#### Leticia Maldonado/Stamos

In the early 70s, Leticia worked for the United Farm Workers of America under the leadership of the late labor and civil rights leader, Cesar Chavez. She continues her commitment to farm workers and underserved populations by serving on the board of the Cesar Chavez Foundation, formerly the National Farm Workers' Service Center. Leticia's professional experience includes a stint with the University of California in the Bay Area implementing the Puente Project as the High School State Coordinator, and also the Urban Corps of San Diego as the Community Development Director. Leticia spent her first 20 years of professional experience with the Boy Scouts of America in the San Francisco

Bay Area after earning a Bachelor's degree from San Jose State University. Leticia eventually became the first woman in the United States to hold a management field position with the Boy Scouts.



PROGRAM: Zita Dixon, AAUW American Fellow

Zita was awarded an American Fellowship from AAUW for 2019-2020 to earn her PhD in Social Policy from Brandeis University in Massachusetts. Zita has a passion for mentoring students.



**Project Name:** A Historical Case Study of the City University of New York's Search for Education, Elevation and Knowledge Policy-Making Process and Advocacy Efforts to Maintain It . Zita Dixon's research focuses on critically examining racial equity in policy-making participation and advocacy. Her dissertation examines a New York State policy that holistically addresses higher-education access and attainment for underrepresented students and how various stakeholders maintain its hold as a policy for more than 50 years. She hopes to become a tenure-track professor and to continue researching how those directly impacted by a social issue (and workers who directly address it) participate in the policymaking process.

Zita graduated from UC San Diego in 2003 with a BA in Third World Studies. She graduated high school in south east San Diego and her family moved to Fallbrook about 10 years ago. In 2005 Zita earned a Masters degree in Social Work from Columbia University. Since high school Zita has been involved in mentoring programs and as a high school student attended UC San Diego Summer Bridge which gave her a strong foundation to succeed. Currently Zita mentors Brandeis University undergraduate students with the Posse Foundation to support future leaders. Zita enthusiastically encourages questions from our members regarding mentoring students.
