Renewed STEM Momentum


Thanks to a generous bequest from AAUW member and scientific pioneer Nancy Grace Roman, National AAUW is pursuing several important STEM initiatives this fall. Roman, who died in 2018, served as NASA's first chief astronomer and is known as the mother of the Hubble Telescope. We're launching projects to increase STEM participation by women of color and expand opportunities in the physical sciences and engineering. We'll also assess how parents and guardians can influence higher educational choices for girls

September meeting with Zita Dixon

AAUW Fellow Zita Dixon presented us with her PHD case study of SEEK (Search for Education, Elevation and Knowledge), a New York City program. This was done via ZOOM.

She received a degree in Social Work at Brandeis University in Massachusetts.

Zita has also worked for SEIU (Service Employees International Union) on an issues-based campaign for health care. This work in the District of Columbia was a reform project which predated the passage of the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

SEEK is a program to support low income students with academic potential. Her dissertation is an analysis of what makes the program work; how was the legislation passed; and how was it protected?


She used the Critical Race Theory, CRT, in her analysis. The premise of this theory is that although race is a social construct, it has consequences in reality.

She will defend her study at the end of the semester and will apply to be a faculty member.
