Congratulations to all of the hard-working and successful young women. Their college futures will be greatly enhanced because of the generosity of the donors.



## **Public Policy**

This month, our hearts are both heavy and hopeful. On April 15, 2021, the House of Representatives voted 217-210 to pass the Paycheck Fairness Act with bipartisan support. Your tireless work is a huge reason we are one giant step closer to the bill becoming law. But this past month has also marked a continuation of hard and scary times, with racist attacks, tragic shootings and troubling bills across the states. We are proud to work hand in hand with you to ensure that tomorrow looks brighter.

Now that PFA has passed the House, it joins several AAUW public policy priorities waiting for action in the Senate. These bipartisan bills need your vocal support now more than ever:

- Paycheck Fairness Act (PFA): AAUW has worked for decades to pass this landmark legislation to advance pay equity, and this is the year it will finally triumph. Demand equal pay for equal work!
- Equal Rights Amendment (ERA): The historic amendment, which would once and for all ensure constitutional gender equality, was first proposed nearly 100 years ago. Tell your Senators to <u>ratify the ERA now!</u>
- Equality Act: America's civil rights laws should provide explicit protections against discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity. Ensure your Senators know equality means including all people!

#### **American Jobs Plan**

President Biden announced the \$1.5 trillion American Jobs Plan to continue the mission of "building back better." On the heels of the American Rescue Plan, this first federal discretionary spending proposal invests heavily in education, housing, public health and climate change to address the country's most pressing needs. Among other things, it proposes:

- Critical funding for education:
  - A 41% increase to the Education Department budget, most of which targets
     Title I programs for high-poverty schools.
  - \$100 billion to upgrade and build new public schools, investing \$12 billion in community college infrastructure and \$25 billion to upgrade child-care facilities.
  - \$3 billion to increase federal Pell Grants, increasing the maximum award by
     \$400 and making Dreamers eligible for the grants.
  - \$15 billion to create up to 200 centers of excellence that serve as research incubators at historically Black colleges and universities (HBCUs), to provide graduate fellowships for underserved populations
  - \$1 billion to the Department of Justice for Violence Against Women Act programs, including funding to support women at historically Black colleges and universities (HBCUs), Hispanic-serving institutions (HSIs) and Tribal colleges and universities (TCUs).
- Urgent investment in our nation's workplaces:
  - \$400 billion for the "<u>Care Economy</u>," to expand access to home- or community-based care and provide higher wages and more benefits for caregivers, who are disproportionately women of color, have largely stayed on the job throughout the COVID-19 crisis.
  - \$48 billion for American workforce development infrastructure, which would focus on registered apprenticeships and pre-apprenticeships, creating millions of new registered apprenticeship slots.

- \$40 billion for a new Dislocated Workers Program and training in many sectors, including clean energy, manufacturing and caregiving.
- A \$10 billion investment in workforce enforcement penalties to compensate workers when employers violate workplace safety and health rules.

## AAUW Fallbrook Board Minutes – Summary

### April 14, 2021 @ 10:30 am

The meeting was held via Zoom. Elizabeth Leader facilitated the Zoom call. Present: Elizabeth Leader, Kathy Bierbrauer, Pamela Nevills, Young Milton, Margie Mosavi, Susan Duling.

**Treasurer's Report** – Total funds in checking and savings accounts in the amount of \$39,098. Of this amount \$10,012 is in the checking account. Elizabeth recommends that Fallbrook AAUW retain a minimum of \$7,000. In the checking account, which is equal to one year's expenses.

**Membership** - AAUW members are reminded to pay their **membership dues** of \$98. Membership renewal emails were sent out this month. The email comes from <a href="memberinfo@aauw.org">memberinfo@aauw.org</a> and contains a personal link that will take you to the national website where you can easily pay your dues via a credit card. This is the preferred method to renew your membership as it saves the Treasurer significant time in processing memberships and it saves you a stamp and envelope! If you are unable to pay on line, payment can be sent in care of Elizabeth Leader at P.O. Box 1061, Fallbrook, CA 92028-1061. Checks should be made out to AAUW Fallbrook.

**Scholarship** – Margie reported there are eight scholarship applicants. A committee consisting of Karen Langer-Baker, Carlene Friesen, and Margie Mosavi completed in person, outdoor interviews of the candidates. One interview was via Skype. Those with the highest scores may be awarded higher amounts. The committee will announce the recipients and amounts at the next general meeting, May1st.

**Other Business** - AAUW Board for upcoming year has some open positions for the board and chairpersons for special interest groups. Members will be reminded of these open positions, so they can be involved by accepting a position.
