President's Message September 2021

We can be proud of our accomplishments: The mentorship program, Tech Trek, and the AVID scholarship program are important contributions to our community, and further AAUW's mission of promoting equity for girls and women.

In the past few days, I have been reflecting on the situation in Afghanistan. It is heartbreaking to contemplate the probability that Afghan women, who have made such amazing progress toward equity in the past 20 years, will probably lose some or all of the freedoms they have fought so hard for. A young Afghan female TV anchor, Behesta Arghand, who was permitted to interview a Taliban spokesman, has fled the country. In contrast, the brave reporting by Clarissa Ward (CNN) and Jane Ferguson (PBS) shows how far women have come in the media industry since Nancy Dickerson broke through TV journalism's all male fortress. As Clarissa Ward explains, feeling empathy, especially for women and children, has changed her reporting on war and its effects on noncombatants. In my opinion, empathy and promoting equity go hand in hand.



...of the "Miss Sadie Brown Mysteries" series, featuring Miss Sadie Brown, aviatrix, newspaper columnist/reporter and undercover snoop. "Sadie challenges the pre-WWI convention that women belong at home attending to their husbands and raising their children. Female Sleuth? Women Flying? Equal Pay? It's a battle out there." Three books in the series:

"Murder at the Expo: Miss Sadie Brown and the Death of Dr. Wolf": a fun-filled but deadly romp through 1915 San Diego, Balboa Park, Fallbrook, Redondo Beach, Santa Barbara, LA's Chinatown, and Tijuana.

"Murder at the Séance: Miss Sadie Brown & the Death of Madame Valesky": set in the summer of 1917 at seaside Coronado and Mare Island Naval Shipyard, Vallejo, Sadie investigates the case of a charlatan fortuneteller and a serial killer traveling the coast of California.

"Murder at the Stage Door": set in 1920, Sadie investigates a mysterious death in San Diego's Gaiety Theater fire in 1900. Twenty years later, her friend is accused of murder and Sadie is determined to discover the truth amongst the remaining retired vaudevillians. Some scenes are set in 1920 Bonsall.

Summary of the Board and Chairperson Meeting, August 4, 2021

As you are aware, Tech Trek was greatly impacted during the last year. An on-line summer program was available for 2020, but AAUW Fallbrook opted out of the Zoom program for 2021, as there was a concern for more on-line meetings for the young girls. A program for summer, 2022 is uncertain and in person housing may be unavailable at university campuses. This concern places uncertainty for budget planning. Revisions to the proposed budget will be available for approval at the September meeting.

Due to new Covid restrictions the members of the board decided to change the August New Member Program from an indoor activity to an outdoor space. The rescheduled event will be at the Hilltop Center on Saturday, August 21st from 4 to 5:30 pm. We all are excited to welcome new and continuing members to this one-time-a-year event.

An inspiring program is scheduled for our 75th Anniversary Celebration on September 11th. The meeting will be graced with an introduction to and a showing of the movie/documentary "Women Talk: Women of History." The Quad Collaborative began as a group of interested AAUW members and Fallbrook Scarecrow builders. Attendees will learn about this staged-play reading and production for our anniversary celebration. AAUW has a guide that provides some easy steps to running a successful voter registration campaign. National Voter Registration Day this year is on September 28.

Did you know?

Conditional Voter Registration (CVR)

The last date to register for California's Sept. 14 Special Election was August 30. But eligible San Diego County residents who miss the voter registration deadline still have an option to vote. Under California Election Law, **Conditional Voter Registration (CVR)** allows a prospective voter to register conditionally and cast a provisional ballot.

Conditional Voter Registration is only available **in person**, and you will need to allow for the extra time it will take you to fill out additional forms before voting.

How this works:

- If you miss the registration deadline for an upcoming election, you can still vote by visiting:
 - The Registrar of Voters office at 5600 Overland Ave., San Diego, CA 92123, during the 14 days prior to and including Election Day, or
 - Any in-person voting location open during the three days prior to and including Election Day.

Voter registration takes on average just two minutes to complete. Whether you want to register yourself or assist others in your community, start here! SDVote.com
