SPOTLIGHT: *This is the first in a series of articles about the many amazing women in the local Fallbrook AAUW Chapter.*

Margaret Mosavi has shown us all how to take the lead. As our AAUW President she will be letting loose the reins after 2 years in 2023 when her term expires; she will be transferring HER President's gavel to longtime AAUW member and mentorship leader Karen Langer Baker. Margaret will continue to serve in a public arena if she is elected to become the Health Care District's representative for zone 3. As Margie is well - known to advocate for citizen activism she wants to be sure everyone gets out the vote!



Margie credits her openness and interest in world affairs beginning with many moves she had to make as a military kid. Born and raised in Ohio at age 9 she moved to Normandy, France where she first went to a private American school and then completed one year in a French Public School where her interest in French was certainly fostered. Margaret has a concrete but warm and fuzzy memory of rescuing and caring for rabbits which she brought home to live safely in their hutches. Margie indicates she feels fortunate to have been educated abroad. In 1957 at the age of 12 Margie returned to SW Ohio near Milford where she was admitted to the 7 th grade. As one of 3 sisters and 2 brothers the family was accustomed to moving every 3 years through her father's position in the air force as a pilot during World War II. But Margie took this move in stride like all the others.

EARLY MARGIE :

In 1966 while attending Miami University of Ohio Margaret was charmed by - and married - the handsome, bright and funny engineer Reza Mousavi. Margie's earlier formative European years helped establish her interest and pursuit in a dual major of French and English. From Ohio they relocated to an area outside Atlanta in NE, Georgia which was considered to be a part of what is called Appalachia. They lived there for 12 years and both observed others who were considered poor. After living

there for 12 years similar to her life in childhood, Margie adapted to several relocations such as Monsey in Rockland NY based on moves due to her husband's career promotions and research successes. They enjoyed traveling throughout the US, visiting her parents at times in Maine and being able to see her grandparents who lived in nearby Indian Hill Village, Ohio, a Cincinnati suburb known for luminaries such as Neill Armstrong and musician Peter Frampton.

After 16 years in Georgia, and while completing his PhD, the family received an invitation for Reza to return to work for the Government of Iran in their atomic energy department.

consider returning there to work for the country's atomic energy commission. This invitation was well-received as it was a great job with an opportunity to be near his own family after living extensively in the USA.

So, by 1975 they moved to Tehran and they lived in a comfortable apartment near work when she became pregnant with her first daughter Leila (called Tessa); in 1976 they moved to a planned Western-influenced subdivision where they welcomed a second daughter Sara. In 1979 came the tumultuous fall of the Shah of Iran. While there Margie taught at Farsi at a pre-school named "RASTAKHIZ" - which actually translates to the word resurrection.

This school was for Iran's children of the elite and the well-educated. They were notified that there were riots a few blocks away so they had to borrow the chadors of their property manager's wife in order to escape safely.

Though the students were safe because they were local kids, not so for the teachers. They had to disguise themselves with borrowed chadors from the property manager's wife. They were forced to cover their faces carefully to hide their nationality. After quickly painting over the school sign on the bus they vacated the school which remained closed for 2 years. Afterwards the Islamic Republic leaders continued to carry on a campaign against America and Israel making it risky to remain. They returned to Georgia and lived a happy and full life until it was time to retire.

FALLBROOK - Here they come!

Though Husband REZA had a highly technical and successful engineering job working for the surgical division of a large medical supply manufacturing company in Georgia they yearned to move WEST once he retired as a scientist.

Upon retirement The Mousavi's moved to California in order to be within shouting distance of their daughter and son-in-law, a successful orthodontist in Solana Beach. Her second daughter lives in England and they do cross the pond to visit.

They found a wonderful house with great outdoor space for a rose garden while inside there was a most perfect nook for her cherished niche cabinet able to display family mementos. It was their cabinet fitting perfectly into that niche which helped them know they had found their forever home.

After first moving to Fallbrook, Margie became active in Newcomers and then Encore Clubs eventually being invited to join AAUW- Fallbrook. This group of interested women was eager to initiate a book club and along with Cynthia Young, Margie was instrumental in forming the monthly reading club with vigorous discussions which continues to expand each season. Margie first volunteered as secretary and then suddenly found herself with a gavel in her hand. Though the past two years have gone swiftly, with new members and their energy joining in under her leadership, AAUW's programming has been expanded to include general interest presentations to the greater Fallbrook community. We know Margie will continue to remain active in many aspects of AAUW - Fallbrook once she leaves office. It is a certainty that she will continue to carry on with an intended legacy meant to expand AAUW's outreach to many diverse populations with sincere invitations to take their rightful place at the table.

AAUW organization. It never ceases to amaze me how much commitment, talent, and compassion is right around me. If you look at the AAUW programs, activities, outings and people through the years to the current day you can discover the makeup of AAUW's varied members.

When a person joins a group of any kind there is a trial of wait and see. I grew up as one who seldom joined groups unless they "did something." That certainly is what AAUW has been committed to through time on local, state and National Chapter levels. Through OUR LEADER Margaret we have continued to "do something" substantive in the mentoring program and general outreach to expand inclusiveness in AAUW Fallbrook.

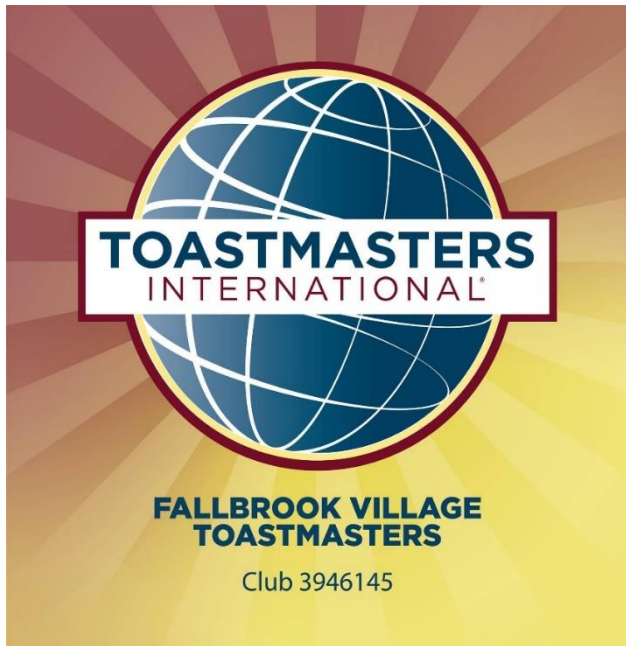

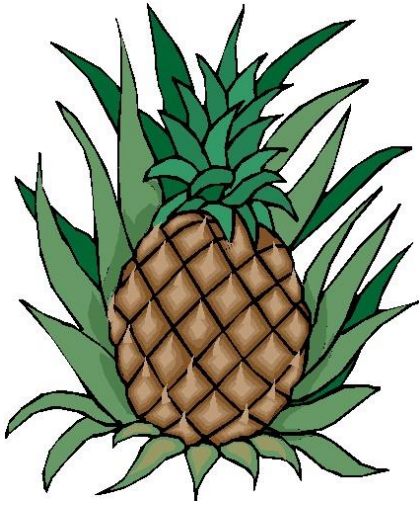

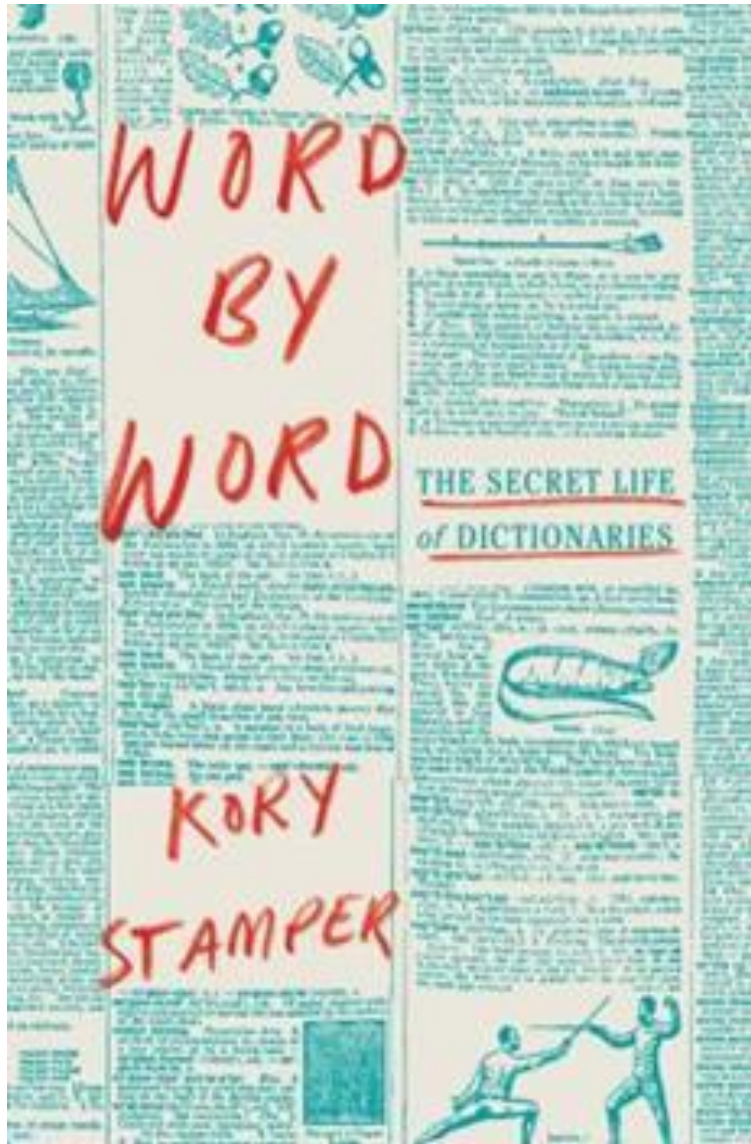
