AAUW Board Meeting Minutes

The meeting was held at Patti Carleson's home, Decembet 7, beginning at 10:21 am.

Approval of Previous Minutes - Suggested corrections by members were corrected prior to final minutes. Minutes were approved.

Correspondence – AAUW Corresponding Secretary Log was submitted by Susan Duling and is attached at the end of this report of the minutes. Susan, as Corresponding Secretary, will check the chapter's Google Docs every three days or so and forward docs, as appropriate, to other board members.

Treasurer's Report – Karen Trapane stated that the bank accounts have been transferred to Chase Bank, Fallbrook. No changes in the savings or checking amounts from November. Karen volunteered to find ways to promote our local branch through her Chamber of Commerce membership on the board.

This is a joint meeting with the Inland Branch Council, and hosted by our branch. Members were reminded to sign-up. Three people are needed for sign-in. An opportunity basket will feature a Fallbrook theme.



Lucy and Sarah are also preparing for a once-in-a-lifetime trip to Italy, where his oldest



friend, a renowned painter, has exiled himself far from anything they'd known in childhood. In fact, the exact nature of their friendship is one of the many mysteries Lucy hopes to untangle in the "history" he's writing of his hometown and family. And with his story interspersed with that of Noonan, the native son who'd fled so long ago, the destinies building up around both of them (and Sarah, too) are relentless, constantly surprising, and utterly revealing.

Bridge of Sighs is classic Russo, coursing with smalltown rhythms and the claims of family, yet it is brilliantly enlarged by an expatriate whose motivations and experiences—often contrary, sometimes not—prove every bit as mesmerizing as they resonate through these richly different lives. Here is a town, as well as a world, defined by magnificent and nearly devastating contradictions.
