Black History Month (February)

It's inspiring to be reminded of early pioneers—but we must also remember that Black women make history every day,

Amanda Gorman |Poet, Actívíst| 1998



An American poet and activist, Gorman made history as the youngest poet to read at a presidential inauguration in United States history, when her poem, "The Hills We Climb" catapulted her into international stardom. Raised by a single mother in Los Angeles, Gorman overcame speech and vocal impediments, crediting this challenge for her growth as a reader and writer. Known for writing work that focuses on oppression, race, feminism, marginalization and the complexities of the African Diaspora, she was inspired by Nobel Prize laureate Malala Yousafzai to become a youth delegate for the UN in 2013. In 2014, she was chosen youth poet laureate of Los Angeles and not a year later, published her first poetry book "The One for Whom Food is Not Enough". In 2017, while at Harvard College, she became recognized as the first National Youth Laureate and was awarded the OZY Genius Award


Conversation with Amanda, "Poetry and language are often at the heartbeat of movements for change. If we look to the Black Lives Matter protests , you see banners that say, *"They buried us but they didn't know we were seeds".* That's poetry being marshaled to speak of racial justice. If you analyze Martin Luther King's "<u>I Have a</u> <u>Dream</u>" speech, it's a great document of rhetoric that's also a great document of poetry,

of imagery, of song. Never underestimate <u>the power of art</u> as the language of the people."


You probably don't know her name but you should.

Marian Croak is behind the tech that enables us to talk on FaceTime, Zoom, and other apps that connect friends, family and others around the globe. Marian Croak from the Great Class of 1977 holds the patent for Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP), which helps us make calls over the internet instead of a phone line. Marian Croak has spent her life inventing. After graduating from #princetonuniversity and earning her Ph.D. from #uscedu, she worked at Bell Labs-Nokia in New Jersey, creating technologies "in service of humanity." She went on to work for AT&T and is now vice president of engineering at Google.



In 2022, Marian, owner of 200+ U.S. patents, was one of the first two Black women to be inducted to the National Inventors Hall of Fame. Among her inventions is the text-to-donate function that her team helped create in the wake of Hurricane Katrina, which has helped to raise millions of dollars since its inception in 2005. Croak also leads the Research Center for Responsible AI and Human Centered Technology at Google, which "ensures that Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning positively impacts users and the world, particularly marginalized communities."




Book Club (Meets the 3^{rd} Monday of the month at 10:30)

The Bibliobabes, as we affectionately call the members of our Fallbrook AAUW book club, continue to meet monthly.

March 20 - Margie's selection, "Caste", by Isabel Wilkerson

In *Caste*, Isabel Wilkerson argues that the racial tensions in the United States are better



explained through the lens of caste, not race—a 400-year-old hierarchy placing white people at the top and Black people at the bottom. Wilkerson examines the different caste systems around the world and how they damage the lives of everyone involved, even those at the top. She believes that to understand how to move forward, we must examine the past and the racial structures that keep progress as a nation at bay.

In this guide, we'll explore the basics of Wilkerson's caste theory, the eight tenets of a caste system, how the caste system affects the lives of people in the upper and lower castes, and how we can move away from caste and create a more equitable society.
