AAUW Board Meeting Summary

The meeting was held at Patty Carlson's home.

Approval of Previous Minutes – Motion passed to accept the minutes from the February. Board and committee reports were gathered for February and March

Correspondence – Susan Duling

March 31, 2023. Susan Duling Corresponding Secretary report, Webpage manager A written report was provided for the Board meeting.

Treasurer's Report – Karen Trapane

A Finance Report was provided to the board. Checking Balance, April 5, 2023 is 11,603.73. Savings Balance is \$29,079.65. The report included a list of transactions The board also reviewed the Actual Budget for the 2022-2023 year. Please note some donation checks that were made to AAUW with Scholarship as a notation and have been placed in the general fund account, rather than the non-endowment fund for Scholarships. Karen reported a review of our agreement with Legacy that clearly states that the AAUW Scholarship committee is in charge of the process and awards to Fallbrook High School AVID students.

Nominating Committee – Karen Trapane

The other committee members are Elizabeth Ward and Carolyn Thom. Personal contacts are being made to join the new board. Open positions are 2st Vice President of Membership, 3rd Vice President for Fund Raising, and Recording Secretary. Elizabeth Leader proposed that our new president, Karen Langer-Baker appoint a position for strategic planning for the next year.

Mentorship Program – Karen Langer Baker

Karen will be leaving this position as she moves into the Chapter President position, but will continue to be involved and supportive of the program with Carolyn Thom. The new chairperson will be Marli Shoop. It is proposed that the mentors will sponsor or host events. New mentors for the Avid program sophomore students will be encouraged to sign up at the Membership Tea. Mary Begley, AVID teacher at FUHS, will nominate students who qualify to be mentees. The participant mentor/mentee pairs are assigned in August and September.

Tech Trek – Sharon Robinson

The 8th grade applicants were interviewed on April 30th. Parents and girls socialized at Bakin it Up Coffee House, while groups of three were interviewed at Sharon's on Main Six girls were selected to attend the week-long camp this summer. Scholarship - Pamela Nevills

Eleven applications were received by the February 28 deadline. Although the AVID senior girls who applied were asked to complete applications and submit them as attachments to an email, only one girl did. The scholarship committee recommends that if this requirement continues the instructions must be specific. Eleven girls completed applications and the interviews, which were held on March 27th at the FUHS Career.

Each girl received a scholarship. The awards varied based on points received from a review of the applications and an interview score. Letters have been sent to the girls notifying them of their scholarship amounts and inviting them to the Award Ceremony at FUHS and the AAUW award celebration on June 3rd.

Diversity – Diane Summers

The group continues to meet once a month. For April they will meet Wednesday the 26th at Diane's home, 2345 Trail End. The meeting is open to all AAUW members and guests are always welcomed.

Other Business/Reports –

Fundraising/Donor Ideas – Karen Trapane. Discussion was held of how people and businesses outside our membership could be encouraged to provide financial support, and how can Fund Raising be an all-year event rather than being focused on one event? These ideas will be conveyed to the 3rd V.P. when the position is filled on the new board.

Karin Moore was selected from a large pool of proposals to present at NCCWSL conference in Washington D.C. We are proud of this member's achievements and selection as a presenter at this prestigious leadership conference for young future women leaders.

New Business -

Patti Carlson proposed that the board meet on a quarterly basis rather than the current monthly schedule. Following discussion and input from future chapter president, Karen Langer Baker, it was decided to forego a decision at this time. Karen suggested an executive committee meeting every other month, possibly by Zoom and an executive committee and chairperson in-person meeting on off months. 

Next Meeting May 15 to discuss The Night Watchman by Louise Erdrich



Louise Erdrich, in her 16th novel, returns to North Dakota, to the Turtle Mountain Reservation of her tribe, the Chippewa. The author's afterword explains she was recovering from a winter virus, short of writerly confidence and inspiration, when she reread her grandfather's letters written in 1953 — the year of her birth.

At that time, a bill before Congress threatened to terminate the tribe's rights to the reservation land and enforce involuntary resettlement in cities. Her grandfather was the chairman of the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa Advisory Committee to the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

His committee had no legislative leverage, nor financial resources, but mounted a strategic resistance to the

termination proposed by the bill. Her grandfather's response to the threat inspired <u>*The*</u> <u>*Night Watchman*</u>, and he is the model for its protagonist, Thomas Wazhusk.
