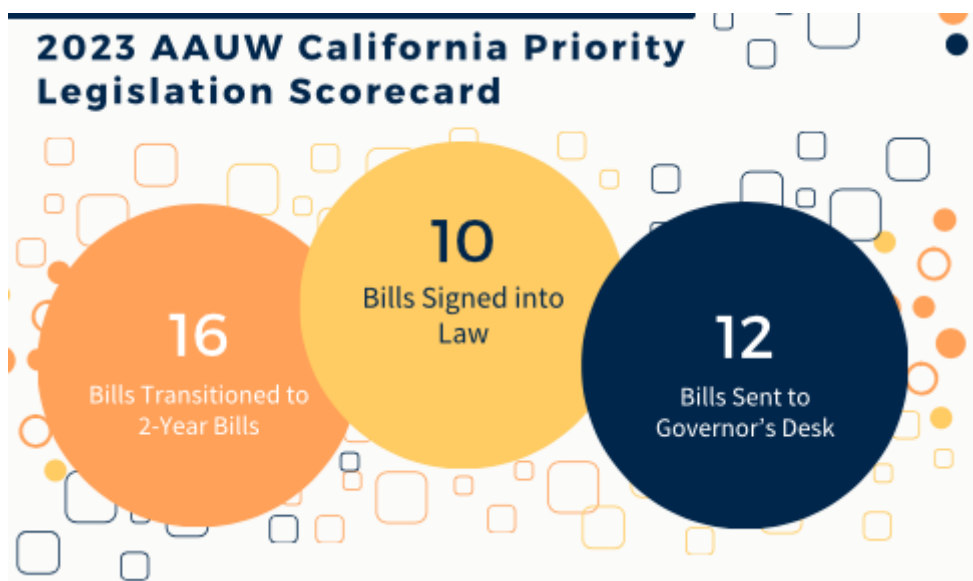
2023 California Legislative Session Round-Up: AAUW California's Priority Legislation

September 14, 2023 was a tense day in Sacramento: [the last day for each House to pass bills that could be sent on to the governor](#). After at least nine months of writing, researching, amending, and lobbying, the legislative session drew to a close. So how did AAUW California's priority legislation fare?

While, at the time of writing, AAUW California still has some priority legislation sitting on the governor's desk (he has until October 14, 2023 to sign), we are happy to report that our priority bills did pretty well in this cycle!

Priority Legislation by the Numbers



Note that legislation listed as a "2-year bill" will be reconsidered in the 2024 legislative cycle.

A-Level Bills

Our three A-level bills this year were AB 1394, AB 549, and SB680. AAUW California was also a co-sponsor on AB1394. While none of our A-level bills have yet been signed into law, AB 1394 is currently sitting on the Governor's desk awaiting a signature. AB 549 and SB 680 have both been transformed into 2-year bills.

AB 1394. Sent to Governor's Desk. Authored by Assemblymember Buffy Wicks, and co-sponsored by AAUW California, this bill seeks to help child sex abuse survivors remove their images from social media platforms.

AB 549. 2-Year Bill. Authored by Assemblymember Lori Wilson. This bill would require all state agencies to conduct an evaluation of their own departments to ensure that the state does not discriminate against women through the allocation of funding and the delivery of services.

SB 680. 2-Year Bill. Authored by Senator Nancy Skinner, this bill prohibits a social media platform from using a design, algorithm, or feature that the platform knows, or should have known, causes child users to experience addiction to the social media platform.

B-Level Bills

Our four B-level bills this year were AB 524, AB 1071, AB 1078, and SB 36. AAUW California added AB 1078 later in the session at the request of the School Board Project Subcommittee, as it deals with preserving historically accurate and representative curricula for public schools in California. We are excited to report that two of our B-level bills have been signed into law: AB 1071 and AB 1078. AB 524 is still sitting on the Governor's desk and SB 36 has been transformed into a 2-year bill.

AB 524. On governor's desk. Authored by Assemblymember Buffy Wicks, this bill would prohibit discrimination against employees based on their status as a family caregiver.

AB 1071. Signed into Law! Authored by Assemblymember Joshua Hoover, this bill would authorize and encourage school districts, county offices of education, and charter schools to provide teen dating violence prevention (TDV) education to all pupils in grades 7-12, and make TDV resources available on its website.

AB 1078. Signed into Law! Authored by Assemblymember Dr. Corey Jackson, this bill expands the diversity of the social science curriculum, requiring instruction in social sciences to include a study of the role and contributions of people of all genders, Latino Americans, LGBTQ+ Americans, and other ethnic cultural, religious and socioeconomic status groups. If the school district has not provided sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, their local control funding formula allocation will be reduced.

SB 36. 2-Year Bill. Authored by Senator Nancy Skinner, this bill provides protections and support for any person fleeing prosecution, conviction, or sentence from another state for seeking abortion, contraception, reproductive care, or seeking gender-affirming care in California. It also provides protections for any person assisting the person seeking that care.

C-Level Bills

We had thirty-one C-level bills this year. Eight of our C-level bills were signed into law. Ten are awaiting the governor's signature, and thirteen are now 2-year bills.

Learning by Fire: Carole Hodges Speaks at Toastmasters

AAUW member Carole Hodges and her husband Paul lost nearly everything they owned in a house fire that started from rodents chewing electrical cords. Instead of focusing on

the losses, Carole turned the devastating experience into a compelling Toastmasters speech that both educated us on the lessons Life teaches and filled us all in with the details, and... AAUW members were there to support her! (Carole and Paul were founding members of the Fallbrook Village Toastmasters Club.)

For those of you who do not know, she and her husband lived in the guest home of another AAUW member, Liz Jamieson-Dunne (also a founding member of Toastmasters). The good news for Carole and Paul is that they were there when it started, and they were able to get out safely. The bad news is that it was scary, and it is going to take a long time to recover.

Here are a few excerpts from Carole's speech titled "Learning by Fire":

"I went one door further to our storeroom. It was strong in there. I pulled out the vacuum; I pulled out the clothes steamer, and then a puff of smoke came through the vent, and I thought THE WORKSHOP! Paul opened the door to the workshop and was forced back by a puff of smoke. He got down on his hands and knees to see what it was, and he said, 'I see it, fire!'" When Carole called 911, she got a message, "You have reached 911, please hold..." As she brought the dogs to safety, the fire continued to grow. Four gardeners lived in the RV behind the house and Paul was able to tell them to get out before the fire completely engulfed it. Finally, the 911 operator came on the line and Carole yelled, "MY HOUSE IS ON FIRE!" She went on to say, "I had no idea how fast fire can spread!" Once the fire department was on the scene and extinguishing the fire, Carole and Paul had a chance to sit down because the fire department wouldn't let anyone go anywhere near the fire. "After running, running and running," Carole explains, "...there was nothing we could do, but take a deep breath, and just be together...and that was the moment the most surprising thing happened. There was a calmness that came over us." As they sat there together, they realized that even though the realization that they may lose everything was on their minds, they also realized that they were okay. The gardeners were okay, the dogs were okay, and they were okay. Carole asked one of the firemen to please get her purse. When he came out, he not only gave her the purse but also a post-it note that he saw still attached to the door. The note read, "How can you enjoy this moment even more?"

Carole's deeper message to all of us, in her words, is this, "Accept whatever happens in this moment as an opportunity to grow. We have the power and resilience by greeting each day with courage and humility."

The mentorship program held two group activities in the month of October. The second was a Scarecrow Walk on Wednesday, October 25, when mentors picked up their mentees at the high school, walked

around downtown and then went for frozen yogurt. They had the opportunity to attend a brief presentation on the Scarecrow project as they met with Jackie Heyneman who started the Scarecrow Tradition 12 years ago and AAUW member Nancy Heins-Glaser who has been highly influential in the promotion of the program through her active and enthusiastic involvement. After that the group enjoyed some frozen yogurt.

Jackie Heyneman provides a brief history lesson of how scarecrows marched into Fallbrook from Cambria, Cali. She said AAUW has created a path to include important women in history.

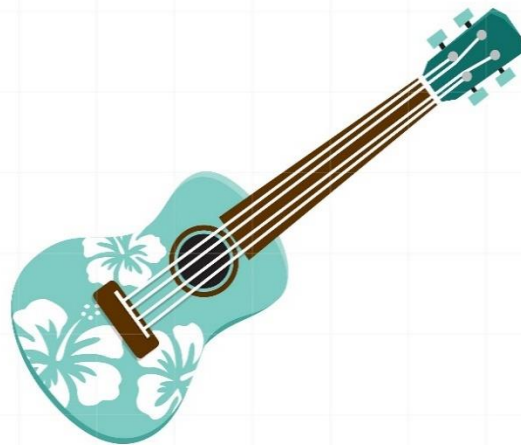
