# CA Proposition 50 Overview from AAUW California

#### What It Does

Proposition 50 asks California voters whether the state should adopt temporary congressional district maps if other states redraw their maps mid-decade for partisan advantage. These temporary maps would apply only if other states redraw their maps, be used only through the 2026–2030 elections, and then expire after the next census-driven redistricting.

### Why It Matters

- Levels the playing field in response to other states' illegal mid-decade redistricting.
- Commits that California resumes independent redistricting after 2030.
- Reaffirms California maps do not dilute voices of historically marginalized communities.
- Protects fair representation and democratic norms.
- Keeps the decision in voters' hands must be directly approved by voters.

- 1. **Ballot Measure** Proposition 50 is on the November 4, 2025, Special Election ballot.
- 2. **Purpose** Allows California to adopt temporary congressional maps.
- 3. **Trigger** Changes only occur if other states redraw maps mid-decade.
